

STOCKTON ON TEES PARISH ELECTIONS

If more than 13 candidates put their names forward, on the 5th of May this year, all residents 18 years of age and over and on the electoral roll for

At the same time as voting for your Parish Councillors you will also be invited to vote for your representatives on the Borough Council and the Referendum on the Alternative Vote System.

YARM & EAGLESCLIFFE AREA ACTION PLAN



Last year Stockton Council brought an abrupt end to work on the

plan which was conceived to preserve the character of Eaglescliffe and Yarm.

In view of the Localism Bill currently going through parliament, the work carried out for the Yarm and Eaglescliffe Area Action Plan can be used as the basis for a 'Neighbourhood Plan' for the area.

Campaigners intend to petition Stockton Borough Council to take the necessary steps to enable this and need 2000 signatures to force a debate.

If you are interested in helping to preserve the character of your parish, watch out for the petition in local shops and businesses.



EGGLESCLIFFE & EAGLESCLIFFE COUNCIL BUDGET

This year your Council was conscious of the financial pressures on so many people when it decided how much to require Stockton Council to collect from households in this civil parish as part of their Council Tax.

After costing the services and overheads of Egglescliffe & Eaglescliffe Council and the 2011 election, it was a question of how much could be afforded for work on further play areas (following on from the new St Margaret's Play Area in 2010) and other improvements.


On your behalf it was decided to budget for £73,508 for the year ending 31st March 2012, a 1.01% reduction on the previous year. This means that a Band D household will pay £23.90 for Parish Council services out of a total Council Tax of £1497.24 in 2011-12.
