REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

Wreaths will be laid on behalf of the Parish on Sunday 9th November 2014 as follows: **St John's Church, Egglescliffe**:

Service commences at 10.00am processing to the War Memorial at 10.55am.

All Saints Church, Preston on Tees

Service commences at 9.45am processing to the War Memorial, Victoria Road at 10.55am

Although there is no formal service, a Poppy Wreath will also be laid at the War Memorial outside Elementis Chromium offices at Urlay Nook.



The parish council is working with St John's Church to commemorate, on the 100th anniversary of their death the fallen from WW1 named on the War Memorials in the parish. The Lest We Forget flag will be flown on each anniversary with wreaths and Commonwealth War Graves commemorative certificates laid at the respective Memorials and in Church.

E&EC Community Awards Scheme

Annual Parish Meeting

PLEASED TO SEE THE SHOPS BACK AGAIN

Many residents turned out to see the formal re-opening of the Orchard shopping parade by Baroness Grey-Thompson (Dame Tanni Grey-Thompson) in September, some two years after the parade was destroyed in a devastating fire. Refreshments were served by the volunteers of **Egglescliffe Community Centre**, which, together with the library and Sainsburys' have kept open throughout. Paul Burrell, whose pharmacy has been operating from a temporary cabin in a car park, is not only back in the parade but also operating a Local **Post Office** – a facility local people have missed for even longer. The PO is open Monday to Friday 9 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. and Saturday 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. This deals with most traditional sub-post-office business, including selling euros, but does not handle Parcelforce, passport applications and vehicle and driving licences.

Owing to Stockton Council's spending cuts, **Egglescliffe Branch Library** is now open only Monday and Tuesday 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2 to 5 p.m. and Thursday 2 to 7 p.m. It is fully wheelchair-accessible from the nearby parking spaces reserved for those with disabled badges. As other businesses move into the parade (including the florist who provided Dame Tanni's bouquet), we wish it every success.

The back of the old parade was a crumbling disgrace, but the shops' yards are enclosed with high fencing with CCTV, which should cut down on undesirable behaviour. However, this left a problem for the public open space behind. This was never well used as a children's play area - if indeed at all. The new fence made it even less accessible and there were concerns what anti-social behaviour might happen out of sight of passers-by. As no-one could come up with a workable alternative, it was agreed between Stockton Council (the landowners) and the owners of the parade (in negotiations in which Egglescliffe & Eaglescliffe Council concurred) that the parade's owners would close off public access to this land and maintain it.



SUMMER FETE



We are also waiting for advice as to whether the strings of lights for the live trees at Orchard Estate and South View can be extended to give a better display.

PLANNING

As reported in the April 2014 *Newsletter*, Egglescliffe & Eaglescliffe Council objected to the proposed public long-stay car park at the foot of "Stoney Bank" because of concerns about traffic entering and leaving **Yarm Road**.

Stockton Council's Planning Committee rejected the original application for the car park on these grounds. However, there is now a fresh, slightly amended planning application pending, to which Egglescliffe & Eaglescliffe Council has made similar objections.

Work on the Neighbourhood
Plan is progressing, the group
of councillors working on the
plan is expecting to meet very
soon with representatives from Planning Aid who
will be advising on our proposed public
questionnaire and how best to progress with
community consultations.

Watch out for the questionnaire dropping through your letterbox later this year — we are hoping that as many residents as possible will respond!

GREEN SPACES UPDATE

The Parish Council after all the delays, has decided to change the name of the garden that was to commemorate the Queens Diamond Jubilee to the **Queen Elizabeth 2nd Garden**. Durham Tees Valley community payback team have made an excellent start by clearing the land and have advised they will continue to keep it clear until the planting can commence. Wilkinson's Landscapes have kindly drawn up a plan for a low maintenance garden filled with colourful, pretty evergreen plants. So hopefully you will see a beautiful garden being created very soon.

Unfortunately there have been problems in trying to improve the look of **Greenfield Drive** roundabout due to various restrictions. Therefore we have asked Stockton Borough Council if they would be prepared to landscape the roundabout which would be funded/sponsored by the Parish Council. We are awaiting a response so watch this space.

Amberley Way play area will soon have a new picnic bench for parents to relax and watch their children play. At **St Margaret's** play area we will continue to gradually change the safety surfacing from bark to grass mat, which is much cheaper and easier to maintain. The next area to be replaced is around the climbing frame. We are still waiting to hear from SBC with regard to a revised plan and decision about drainage improvements at St Margaret's.

We are grateful to Egglescliffe Area Residents Association who have been busy at **Egglescliffe Memorial Garden**, looking after the bedding plants during the summer months and planting up the tubs with new plants to ensure that the garden looks its best for Remembrance Sunday. The Parish Council met the expense of having the broken stone plinths at the War Memorial repaired and cleaned along with the surrounding paving.

A group of Councillors recently braved the weather to plant up the tubs at Eaglescliffe War Memorial in **Tittybottle Park** with some winter flowering plants, again to smarten things up for Remembrance Day services. The railings at both war memorials are also due to be painted soon, hopefully in time for Remembrance Day, however this work is of course dependent on weather conditions.

PCSO Rob Hall

The Parish Council was sad to hear of the death of Rob, who was our well known and much respected local PCSO for some years. His funeral was very well attended by members of the community including several E&EC Councillors.

On behalf of the whole community, sincere condolences to Rob's family.

SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY- CALL 101

Police Community Service Officers came along to a recent council meeting to report on local issues. It was pleasing to hear that crime figures for the last month were low: there had been two burglaries and the category with the highest figure was theft from vehicles, mainly theft of tools from works vehicles. There had been reports of people trying to sell goods door to door and trying door handles, crime prevention advice had been given and people were advised to **call 101 to report suspicious activity**. This enables officers to build up a picture of any 'hot spots' that need patrolling. The telephone number 326326 for Cleveland Police is no longer in operation.
