Having explained the problems in our October 2015 and April 2016 newsletters, we are pleased to report that new floodlights have been installed and are working. The amount of money thought to be needed was identified and the current year's budget took this into account. We are pleased to report that in the end the job came in considerably under budget.

EGGLESCLIFFE LIBRARY CLOSURE



On October 6th Stockton Council decided that Egglescliffe Library should be closed, at the latest by March 2017. It is hoped that the re-opening of the recently refurbished Yarm Library may alleviate problems caused by this closure. Egglescliffe Community Centre is looking at the possibility of extending its book loan service.

PLANNING

- Yarm School have again applied for planning permission to build a foot- and cycle-bridge over the **River Tees** for their pupils and the public from their grounds onto the Egglescliffe bank. We have told Stockton Council our concerns e.g., there is no cycle path on this side of the river; after dark it could provide an easy route for unwelcome activities; we would seek assurances of future maintenance and that the river flow would not be affected.
- Our April 2016 Newsletter indicated our concerns about a planning application (which was later withdrawn) for **1** Abbeyfield Drive. The same comments have been made about a similar new application.
- Stockton Council have not said what they intend to do with Egglescliffe Branch Library following its closure. We understand that it would need repair works costing over £60,000, beyond our means if we had thought of taking over the building. Meanwhile, we pointed out to Stockton that local people needed somewhere where they could access by computer (for instance) Government services (benefits etc.).

EAGLESCLIFFE MEDICAL PRACTICE PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP (PPG)

The PPG exists to provide a link between patients and staff. Their aim is to support the practice to continually improve the provision of healthcare and ensure that patients are at the heart of decision making. Regular meetings, that any patient of the practice is welcome to come along to, are published on the practice website www.eaglescliffemedical.co.uk and advertised on the PPG noticeboard in the waiting room.

In June the group started fundraising activities and took on the challenge to raise £1,800 to help the practice buy an additional Ambulatory Blood Pressure Monitor. This compact device will provide an accurate 24 hour blood pressure reading for patients. If you've visited the practice recently then you may have seen the second hand book stall or taken part in the tombolas and raffles. Thanks to the fantastic support from both patients and local businesses, over £650 has already been raised. 

ST MARGARET'S PLAY AREA

Many of you will know that this play area, between the Grisedale Crescent and Sunningdale Drive areas, has been the subject of arson attacks and vandalism on an unprecedented scale recently. The play equipment was bought originally with a combination of government grant and local council tax (the parish precept) after extensive consultations with school children and adults in the area. Traditional swings were added later at the request of parents and grand-parents. The park has been so well used that the bark safety surfacing wore out and was replaced by grass-mat earlier this year. Just as that work was completed an arson attack on the Portable Toilet provided for the workers resulted in the fire spreading to the tube slide and damaging it. A replacement was ordered, using almost all the budget set aside for play area repairs and improvements in the year April 2016 - March 2017. Before it could be delivered and fitted a second, more serious attack on the slide itself severely damaged other parts of the unit, as well as melting the safety surface underneath it. Meanwhile vandals have damaged one of the logs used for informal seating, climbing and playing.

Your Parish Council has had to carefully consider whether or not to replace the equipment, as the cost of doing the entire job is now almost £20,000. We took advice on crime prevention measures from Cleveland Police and we listened to residents who contacted us. On balance we felt that we had to repair the play unit for the benefit of the children who enjoy it so much. But we also felt strongly that in order to be prudent with public money we needed to take all possible precautions to deter future attacks. To this end we are doing three things:

1. We have passed on to the police evidence we have been given which might help them in their search for the culprits.

2. We are asking everyone who walks through the park or lives near it to keep an eye on it and to report, anonymously if they wish, any suspicious activity to the police.

3. We have invested almost £8000 in having a CCTV camera installed, maintained and monitored by Stockton Council's Surveillance Centre. If after the first year we feel that the camera is still needed we will have to budget a further £4305 per annum for it to remain in use.

This is obviously a huge amount of money to come out of our annual budget and it has had a serious impact: Three projects have been deferred in order to use the money which was allocated to them - new planters for the war memorial at Tittybottle Park, Tree planting near the entrance to Greenfield Drive from Durham Lane and the interpretive plaque for Orchard Estate to go near bus shelter at the entrance to Greenfield Drive. We will try to include them in next year's budget.

We have used £500 of the money put aside for contingencies in the Queen Elizabeth II garden on Urlay Nook Rd

There was money put aside for meetings, consultant advice and for printing of Neighbourhood Plan consultation documents which will not be required before the end of the financial year owing to unforeseen delays in the work and so £3000 could be used for this emergency play area work.

Next year's precept will almost certainly be higher than last year's in order to allow us to do those things which have been delayed through these arson attacks.

It seems obvious to councillors that anyone setting fire to a large plastic structure must have gone home with the smell lingering on their clothes. Someone is protecting these criminals and we ask if you know anything at all which might help the police, please get in touch with them and give them the information. If people get away with these attacks their next "thrill" might be someone's house.

CALLING ALL GARDENERS

The parish council has a number of vacant plots at its allotment site on the A67, known as Eliff's Mill. At the time of writing there is no-one

EAGLESCLIFFE STATION

Stockton Council has done a lot of work on discouraging rail customers from parking on surrounding streets, so we have taken this issue up with them and the company.
