REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

Wreaths will be laid on behalf of the Parish on Sunday 12th November as follows:

St John's Church, Egglescliffe: There will be a service in Church at 10am followed by a procession to Egglescliffe War Memorial at 10.55 am

All Saints Church, Preston on Tees: Service commences at 9.45am, the parade will then make its way to the War Memorial, Victoria Road to lay wreaths at 11am

The Friends of St Margarets Play Area had a successful stall at our Parish Fair and raised £128.80 towards the cost of continuing with CCTV monitoring of the park. The Council is very grateful to them for their efforts. We are relieved that there has been no further serious vandalism since the cameras were introduced. We reported in our last newsletter that the older play equipment for young children at Kingsmead was nearing the end of its life. Inspections have shown it to be safe at present so there are no worries on that level. We have put £10,000 aside from the council tax for 2017-18 and by adding to it from the 2018-19 budget we hope to be in a position to upgrade in time for the summer of 2018.

Thank you to residents who responded to a request on 'Eaglescliffe News' Facebook page for help in identifying the location of the orchard after which Orchard Estate is named. We are now in a position to finalise the design of an explanatory plaque so that the history isn't forgotten by future generations.

As your parish council we are entitled to be notified of and comment on planning applications in this civil parish, although we cannot make the decisions, which normally are made by Stockton Council's Planning Committee or their Officers.

PLANNING

Stockton Planning Committee rejected Yarm School's application for a foot- & cycle-bridge over the **River Tees**, reported in the last two issues of this Newsletter.

We objected to building 130 houses at *Hunter's Rest,* **Urlay Nook Road**, because of the extra traffic turning onto the A67 and also the run-off of rainwater could increase flooding downstream on Nelly Burdon's Beck. At the time of writing, a decision had been postponed by Stockton Planning Committee.

An application to build two more houses at 652A **Yarm Road** was rejected by Stockton planners for the same reason as we gave – extra traffic on the public footpath to Eaglescliffe Old Junction Bridge.

Work continues on the Neighbourhood Plan. We also sent detailed comments to Stockton Council on its Rights of Way Improvement Plan. We suggested making it possible for Eaglescliffe residents to walk safely to Coatham Wood – one way would be a footway alongside **Long Newton Lane**. We would be pleased to supply more details and hear your views.

We are keeping watch over proposals to build homes on Eaglescliffe Golf Course alongside **Yarm Road**, although at the time of writing there was no formal planning application.

ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

Your council recently received a query about the possibility of a dedicated Enforcement Officer to help tackle anti-social behaviour in the parish. Your council has explored this query and found that Ingleby Barwick Town Council has such an arrangement with officers' shifts covering Monday to Saturday at an annual cost of approximately £50,000.

Spending even half that amount would bring an increase on last years precept of almost 30%. After much debate the Council felt that the amount of antisocial behaviour in the parish didn't justify the cost involved



BUTTS LANE PARKING PROBLEMS

Stockton Council has proposed a scheme to help provide a solution to the parking problems on Butts Lane,

particularly at school opening and closing times. These problems are well known to users of the road on a regular basis. The solution suggested is to put double yellow lines on both sides of the lane from its junction with Yarm Road to Grisedale Crescent into which a short no parking zone is extended. This, along with the no parking in front of the school would produce no parking on most of Butts Lane up to the Parish Hall, Whether this scheme would merely shift the problem to other parts of Egglescliffe is a matter for conjecture and debate.



EGGLESCLIFFE PARISH HALL RENOVATIONS

This council supported the plans for renovations of the Parish Hall which will see proper wheelchair and pram access, improved toilets and kitchen facilities, and a better layout of meeting space and storage as well as improved heating and lighting. The group leading on the renovation plans is the Egglescliffe Renovation Group which pulls together Egglescliffe Parish Hall Association and Egglescliffe Area Residents Association along with Ward Councillors and other interested parties. The plans have now been approved by SBC and the group are inviting tenders for the work. Once the tenders have been received they will apply for grants from several grant awarding bodies to complete the work, but meanwhile a number of fund-raising activities have been arranged as well as an online donation page (http://tinyurl.com/ydy4dm2o). If every user, past and present, donated just £5 it would make a huge difference.
