REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

Wreaths will be laid on behalf of the Parish on Sunday 13th November as follows:

St John's Church, Egglescliffe: There will be a service in Church at 10am followed by a procession to Egglescliffe War Memorial at 10.45am.

All Saints Church, Preston on Tees: Service commences at 9.45am, the Parade will then make its way to the War Memorial, Albert Road.

Although there is no formal service, a Poppy Wreath will be laid at the War Memorial outside the Great North Air Ambulance Service offices at Urlay Nook.

OTE ELECTION NEXT YEAR

The term of office of all our parish councillors will lend in May 2023. Anyone (including them, if they so wish) who wishes to be a parish councillor will need to stand for election. However, there will be a difference. Previously, all 13 councillors represented and were elected by the whole civil parish. In 2023 there will be two parish wards, separated by the north-south railway line - seven councillors for Egglescliffe West and six for Egglescliffe East. Candidates will need to stand for one or the other, not both. For each ward separately if there are more candidates than seats there will be a poll (with the electors of that ward only voting); otherwise candidates will be elected unopposed. Candidates will not have to choose to stand in the ward in which they live. Once elected, all parish councillors will act together as the parish council to serve the whole

Meanwhile, there are vacancies on our parish council which can be filled by co-option. If interested this is an opportunity to try being a councillor without a long-term commitment.

PLAY AREAS AND ASB

Sadly we've had ongoing problems with Anti-Social Behaviour at some of our play areas over recent months. Members of the Recreation Committee had a very constructive meeting with the Stockton Borough Council Enforcement Case Manager to discuss the problem. Following that, you might have spotted a new leaflet up in our Council Notice Boards with helpful tips on dealing with ASB. Important points to remember:

- If you see people engaged in damaging the equipment or behaving in a manner that causes anxiety or discomfort to you or others please ring Enforcement on 01642 607943 as soon as you can.
- If the behaviour threatens the safety of you or others, or involves serious actions like arson, please ring the police as soon as possible.
- Even if there isn't an officer free to attend immediately the call will be logged with the time and location, meaning that CCTV can be checked and that the frequency of the problem is better understood and patrols planned accordingly.

Our play areas give hours and hours of pleasure to children in our parish and we don't want them to become un-useable because of the actions of the few.

Please help by notifying Enforcement as soon as you see a problem.

Meanwhile we continue to look at the options for Amberley Way play area from a number of play equipment providers before a full consultation with local people.

PLANNING

The council is very aware of the concerns of many residents of Egglescliffe Village about the plans for housebuilding on farm land around the village. We have pointed out to the Stockton Council that Butts Lane and Back Lane are narrow roads, there is an awkward bend on Butts Lane and there are already problems with the vehicles accessing current developments. We have also pointed out that although there are regular visits from large agricultural vehicles those drivers know the area and the limitations

of the roads. Having new drivers with large vehicles from outside the area is likely to lead to more serious problems. If the decision of the

planning committee is to approve the applications they must limit the hours for deliveries to avoid conflict with the traffic on Butts Lane at the beginning and end of the school day.

We are pleased to see that the construction of a new car park for Eaglescliffe station off Durham Lane has been approved, along with the footbridge needed to access the platforms. When construction is completed it will enable easier access to trains to Darlington, Sunderland, York, London etc. for people on that side of the railway line. Meanwhile, work is being done to try to establish a proper foot- and cyclepath to the new bridge from Black Diamond Way
