REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

Wreaths will be laid on behalf of the Parish on Sunday 12th November as follows:

St John's Church, Egglescliffe: There will be a service in Church at 10.00am,
followed by a procession to Egglescliffe War Memorial at 10.45am.

All Saints Church, Preston on Tees: Service commences at 9.45am,
the Parade will then make its way to the War Memorial, Albert Road.

Although there is no formal service, a Poppy Wreath will be laid at the War Memorial outside the Great North Air Ambulance Service offices at Urlay Nook.

A WORD OF WELCOME FROM THE CHAIR

After our recent local elections, I was honoured to be voted in as Chair for the Parish Council. The elections saw the retirement of Cllrs Rigg, Perrie, Lamond & Edwards, along with the very sad passing of Cllr Mike Lawson; all of whom have been long serving and valuable members of the community and council over many years where they have made such a positive difference!

So, "What does the Parish Council actually do?" Well, let me briefly explain: Egglescliffe & Eaglescliffe Council (E&EC) is the first tier of local government in our area and not related to the Church parish council. It uses a small amount of Council Tax collected via the 'precept' each year for it's work, councillors are unpaid. E&EC is responsible for managing two allotment sites, four play areas, Egglescliffe Green and Memorial Gardens in Egglescliffe, Queen Elizabeth II garden on Urlay Nook Rd and, with Preston Parish Council, Memorial Park (Tittybottle Park) on Yarm Rd. A summer fete has been held on Egglescliffe village green in recent years, please see the Summer Fete article on page 3. The Parish Council also owns the recreation field at Allens West, which is leased partly to Leven Junior Football Club and partly to Taylor Wimpey for the provision of play facilities for older children from the new Allen's West housing development. So we do manage quite an extensive part of the community's amenities!

There are 13 councillors elected for a 4 year period. Currently the Council is short of Councillors and open to *co-opt* new members to fill the vacancies. The full council meetings are monthly with Committee meetings in between, normally outside working hours, further information is available on our website http://www.egglescliffeandeaglescliffe-pc.org.uk We, the parish council, differ from our Ward Councillors and Member of Parliament in that we are non political, and purposely keep it that way. I would also like to take this opportunity to welcome any new residents to the area, especially within our new housing estates. We would love for you to get involved in the community and if after reading this, you're interested in supporting or joining the Parish Council, then please do get in touch. - *Thank you, Councillor Marc de Launay.*

Adult fitness equipment to be installed at St Margaret's Play Area

The Recreation Committee is pleased to announce that adult fitness equipment will be installed at St Margaret's Play Area prior to the end of this financial year. This equipment has been requested by residents and the committee is excited to be able to provide this new amenity for the community. Recreation Budget for financial year 2024/25 — The budget preparations for the next financial year will see the start of a two or three-part programme of works to be carried out in Amberley Way. The first phase will be made up of inclusive equipment, the centrepiece will be an inclusive Wheelchair Accessible Roundabout. The committee is committed to providing inclusive recreation opportunities for all residents, and it believes that this new equipment will be a valuable asset to the community. SUMMER FETE 2023



It was wonderful to see everyone that attended the Summer Fete enjoying themselves and having fun as a community. The events included the Punch and Judy show, magic from Tom Rolfe and music from the excellent Princes of Montecarlo had people on their feet. The Coconut Shy, Face painting, Tombola and naming the Teddy helped raise £642.50 for the Chairmans chosen charities which this year were jointly the Tees River Rescue and the Great North Air Ambulance Service. It was also great to see the local Firefighters calling in between their call outs and local stall holders pitching up to join the fun. The fete is organised with the support of the Egglescliffe Area Residents Association (EARA) and other incredible volunteers. Christmas lighting will be soon be seen in several areas around the parish: on the trees at South View; Yarm Road and Durham Lane and on street lighting columns. The lights will bring a little festive glow to the dark evenings.

Seats on Egglescliffe Village Green

Residents may have noticed that a 2nd tree seat bench has been removed on the Green owing to it's condition. The Parish Council are currently trying to source replacements which are in keeping with the restraints of a rural conservation area.

Planning - What shall we see in our area?


Your parish council has the right to be consulted on all planning applications in its area and to comment on them, although the decisions are made by Stockton Borough Council. We use our local knowledge.

The houses currently being built on **Hunter's Rest Farm** were granted planning permission which provides a public open space behind the backs of houses in Valley Gardens. The developers later applied to build seven bungalows on that space. We opposed this, as the residents of the estate would have no open space nearby on that side of Urlay Nook Road; also, some bungalows would be too close to the electricity grid transmission wires. At the time of going to print, SBC Planning have refused the application.

A cycle-track is proposed for the full length of **Durham Lane** between the Elton A66 interchange and Egglescliffe School, crossing Urlay Nook Road on the west side of the *Tesco* roundabout.

Work should start this Autumn on a large new car park on the west side of **Eaglescliffe Station**, with access from Durham Lane via the Industrial Park. Combined with a new footbridge across the full width of the railway tracks, this will relieve pressure on the existing car park, give access to the Station for people living or working on the west side of the line and mean that residents of the increasing number of houses in west Stockton could catch a train without using Yarm Road.

BELLS BRIDGE - We have expressed concern to Stockton Borough Council and Network Rail about the state of the parapets of **Bells Bridge** (also known as Eaglescliffe Old Junction Bridge), between Yarm Road and Burnmoor Drive. SBC explained they continue to monitor the cracks on the bridge and are in dialogue with Network Rail to plan works into future budgets. E&EC will continue to regularly ask for updates.
